Dear Students, Parents and Community Members:

As we open a new school year, my last as an educator of more than forty years, the excitement and anticipation remain the same. We have spent the summer getting ready for your children and cannot wait to have the halls and classrooms filled with laughter and learning!

I am delighted to be spending the year in transition with our new Deputy Superintendent, Dr. Elizabeth Hallett. Beth, is a talented and experienced educator who comes to us after sixteen years in the Quincy Public Schools, where she served as a high school science teacher, department chair and the ESL Administrator. Most recently she served as the Director of Secondary Education. She received her BA in Italian Studies and Environmental Science from Dickinson College in Pennsylvania and her Master's in Teaching English as a Second Language from Simmons University. Dr. Hallett recently received her doctorate in Educational Leadership from the University of New England. She has also been an adjunct professor at Simmons and Cambridge College, teaching graduate level courses in Sheltered English Instruction (SEI).

We have been busy working on both the inside and outside of our schools this summer. Landscaping, fields and playgrounds have been improved; classroom and hallway floors resurfaced; and new safety and security features added. More importantly, new staff have been hired to replace those who have departed or retired, and we are very excited with this new group who joins our dedicated faculty. All of this has occurred while a full slate of summer school and summer camps have been going on. School no longer stops in June!

As we prepare, we hope that you and your child(ren) are doing the same. Parents often ask me how they can best support their children as they grow and learn. I usually answer by suggesting that they take the steps necessary to make sure their children develop socially and emotionally. If you address proper nutrition, adequate sleep and daily school attendance, we can do our part helping your child acquire the academic skills they will need to be successful in school and beyond. School and home must be a partnership. There are hundreds of ways to make a difference in your child's education – come into our schools and find out what we are doing and what you can do to help!

This *Refrigerator Calendar* is filled with important dates throughout the year and we hope it will provide valuable information about our schools. We hope that you will post it in a prominent place in your home and refer to it often so you can stay involved in your child's education. 
Nantucket Public Schools Policies

All school district policies can be found on the district website: www.npsk.org The policies referenced here are not all inclusive, nor are they included in their entirety.

ATTENDANCE/ABSENCE (Policy JH):

If a student is absent, parents must call the school by 7:50 am. A note signed by a parent/guardian must be submitted to the school principal by the next day for the absence to be considered excused. Class work must be made up. If, under special circumstances, a student needs to miss more than one week of classes, parents must notify the principal's office three weeks before leaving so that teachers can prepare assignments.

Parents/guardians are responsible for student attendance at school. The school will keep parents/guardians informed of student absences and work to determine the appropriateness of planned/optional absences. If a student is absent or suspended from school, misses over ½ a class period or is sent home from school, the student may not participate in any athletic or school activities. In the case of a Friday absence, this prohibits a student from all athletic and school activities over the weekend. The student is not permitted to be in school or on school grounds on the day of the absence.



SNOW DAYS:

If school is cancelled or delayed due to inclement weather or other emergency situations, announcements will be made before 7 am using the following:

- Radio WNAN (91.1 FM), WRZE (96.3), WACK (97.7), WCOD (106 FM)
- Television Channel 5, Channel 7, Channel 18, Channel 25
- Internet www.npsk.org
- ConnectEd (Automated phone call to parents and staff) Enroll or update your information today so you will receive these timely notifications!

Dismissal From School Grounds:

In case of illness, a student must report to the school nurse. The nurse has authorization to dismiss and will contact the parent/guardian. **Students** will not be allowed to participate in after-school activities, including athletics on any day they leave school due to illness.

In case of an outside appointment, students must bring a note to the principal's office before the start of the school day with the time and reason for leaving, and the anticipated time of return. On return, students must check back with the principal's office for a pass to class.

In case of inclement weather, parents/guardians will be notified in the event that students are dismissed.

Please note: Students may not leave school unless dismissed by the School Nurse, Principal, or their designee.



VISITING THE SCHOOLS

Parents and volunteers who wish to visit the school during the school day should follow these procedures:

- When possible, please schedule your visit with the Principal's office or Guidance office in advance of your arrival.
- Please sign in at the Main office upon arrival, turn in photo identification and receive a **Visitor's Pass** to be worn during your stay in the facility. Please sign out when leaving. Return your Visitor's Pass and collect your photo identification.

USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES (Policy KF):

It is the School Committee's desire that the citizens of Nantucket enjoy the use of school property. It is the Committee's intent that such use should take place with proper regard for the safety of the participants and with respect for the preservation of the property for school program use.

School buildings and other school facilities may be used only with permission of the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee. Permission for use of school facilities will be granted for a set period of time, although it is potentially renewable.

Permission to use the buildings and grounds is granted with the understanding that the use shall be subject to cancellation for school activities, school related functions, and Nantucket Town meetings and elections.

The Superintendent will schedule facilities according to the priority list. Use of facilities will be granted on a first come, first serve basis. School functions hold a higher priority than outside requests for facilities use.

Applicants for use of school buildings and other school facilities must follow the procedures outlined in the <u>Application for Use of School Facilities</u> available at the Superintendent's office, on the website and at every school's main office.

School facilities must be used according to the regulations and rental fee schedules recommended by the Superintendent and approved by the School Committee.

SECURITY CAMERAS (Policy ECAF):

In order to ensure the safety and security of our students and staff, security cameras have been installed throughout our school buildings and across our school grounds. These cameras may be used by the administration and/or the Nantucket Police Department in an effort to identify and monitor the conduct of school students, personnel or those outside our school community.

TRANSPORTATION

Bicycles: Please secure and lock your bicycle *in the racks*. Please register your bicycle with the Nantucket Police Department, and put your name or some identifying mark on the bicycle. Always remember to wear a helmet.

Roller blades, skateboards and scooters: Students are requested to leave roller blades, skateboards and scooters at home, because of safety concerns.

ANIMALS IN SCHOOLS (Policy IMG):

For both health and safety reasons, animals are prohibited from school buildings and grounds unless specifically approved by building administration and the Director of Facilities.

DISTRICT DRESS (Policy JICA):

The responsibility for the dress and appearance of the student will rest with individual students, their parents and their school. Through their School Council, and with the approval of the School Committee, each school will establish guidelines for appropriate dress for school and special occasions. They will also establish the actions to be taken by the school in the event that these standards are not adhered to. The administration is authorized to take action in instances where individual dress does not meet the stated requirements.

EMPOWERED DIGITAL USE (Policy IJNDB)

The Nantucket Public Schools provides faculty, students, volunteers, authorized guests and members of the community with access to the NPS digital services, including use of the Internet, in accordance with this policy.

It is expected that all users of the NPS digital services and technology devices will use such services and devices for educational purposes only and act in an ethical and respectful manner. Users have no expectation of privacy for any materials, including but not limited to: email, documents, attachments, images, blogs and any other creation storage and transmission of digital media. The district has the right and responsibility to monitor all such use.

All users are required to sign an Empowered Digital Use agreement which outlines the condition of their use of the district's digital services.

HOMEWORK (Policy IKB):

The School Committee supports the use of homework to advance the learning process. Homework should be developed in a meaningful way and should be developmentally appropriate, increasing as the student proceeds through the grades. Questions at each level should be addressed to the building principal and, if concerns continue, to the Superintendent of Schools.

Nantucket Public Schools' Policies

BULLYING PREVENTION (Policy JICFB):

The Nantucket Public Schools is committed to providing a safe, positive and productive educational environment where students can achieve the highest academic standards. No student shall be subjected to harassment, intimidation, bullying, or cyber-bullying.

"Bullying" is the <u>repeated</u> use by one or more students or staff of a written, verbal, or electronic expression, or a physical act or gesture, or any combination thereof, directed at a target that:

- causes physical or emotional harm to the target or damage to the target's property;
- places the target in reasonable fear of harm to him/herself, or of damage to his/her property;
- creates a hostile environment at school for the target;
- infringes on the rights of the target at school; or
- materially and substantially disrupts the education process or the orderly operation of a school.

"Cyber-bullying" means bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication, which shall include, but shall not be limited to, any transfer of signs, signals, writing, images, sounds, data or intelligence of any nature transmitted in whole or in part by a:

- Wire
- Radio
- electromagnetic
- photo-electronic or photo-optical system, including, but not limited to, electronic mail, internet communications, instant messages or facsimile communications.

Cyber-bullying shall also include the creation of a web page or blog in which the creator assumes the identity of another person or knowingly impersonates another person as author of posted content or messages, if the creation or impersonation creates any of the conditions enumerated in the definition of bullying.

Cyber-bullying shall also include the distribution by electronic means of a communication to more than one person or the posting of material on an electronic medium that may be accessed by one or more persons, if the distribution or posting creates any of the conditions enumerated in the definition of bullying.

Bullying and cyber-bullying may occur in and out of school, during and after school hours, at home and in locations outside of the home. When bullying and cyber-bullying are alleged, the full cooperation and assistance of parents and families is expected.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE (Policies JIC and JK):

Students will be expected to conduct themselves in a way that the rights and privileges of others are not violated. They will be required to respect constituted authority, to conform to school rules and to those provisions of law that apply to their conduct.

Students violating any of the policies on student conduct and control will be subject to disciplinary action. The degree, frequency, and circumstances surrounding each incident shall determine the method used in enforcing these policies. Most of the situations which require disciplinary action can be resolved within the confines of the classroom or as they occur by reasonable but firm reprimand, and/or by teacher conferences with the student and/or parents or guardians.

The purpose of disciplinary action is to restore acceptable behavior. When disciplinary action is necessary, it shall be administered with fairness and shall relate to the individual needs and the individual circumstances.

Disciplinary conferences including pupils, parents, and school personnel called to consider a pupil's misbehavior in school shall always focus on the education and welfare of the pupil. It is the intent of the School Committee that due process in this school system shall evidence high regard for the best interest and welfare of each pupil.

The implementation of the general rules of conduct is the responsibility of the Principal and the professional staff of the building. In order to do this, each school staff in the District shall develop specific rules not inconsistent with the law nor in conflict with School Committee policy. These building rules shall be an extension of the District policies by being more specific as they relate to the individual schools.

If a situation should arise in which there is no applicable written policy, the staff member shall be expected to exercise reasonable and professional judgment.

STUDENT COMPLAINTS AND GRIEVANCES (Policy JII):

The School Committee recognizes that there may be conditions in the school system that are in need of improvement and that students should have some means by which their concerns may be effectively expressed, considered, and dealt with fairly. Such means, if well conceived and understood in advance, can do much to maintain harmonious relationships among the schools and the students and community.

Students and their parents and/or guardians, who believe that a student has received unfair treatment may bring forward their grievance. Appeals of individual disciplinary cases will be required to follow the district's policy on student discipline. Any applicable provisions of the Massachusetts General Laws or federal law will be followed by school officials in conducting hearings and reviews of student grievances. In general, appeals procedures will begin with the authority imposing the penalty (for example, Principal or teacher) and may ultimately be referred to the Superintendent and on to the School Committee, if a policy needs to be approved or changed.

Every attempt will be made to seek a satisfactory solution to any legitimate grievance in a friendly and informal manner.
