





Proficiency Levels of Current ELs


Composite Level

Workshop Learning Objectives

During the workshop, students will:

- **Sight-read and perform a varied repertoire of Disney music**, developing skills in intonation, balance, and tone quality.
- Analyze and describe musical pieces, enhancing their critical listening and evaluative abilities.
- **Understand the expectations of professional musicians**, gaining insights into studio recording environments and industry standards.
- **Incorporate accuracy and expressiveness** to maximize rehearsal productivity and performance quality.
- **Evaluate music and musical performances**, fostering reflective practices and continuous improvement.

Follow-Up Activities

Following their participation in the Disney Imagination Campus Soundtrack Sessions: Instrumental Workshop, students will engage in a series of reflective and performance-based projects that connect their experience in Florida to their ongoing musical development at school.

Written Reflection and Analysis

Students will be guided through structured reflection prompts to help them articulate:

- Differences in rehearsal strategies and conductor expectations between school and the Disney workshop.
- Personal growth in performance skills such as tone quality, blend, articulation, and sight-reading.
- Emotional and cognitive responses to performing in a professional studio environment.
- Insights into the roles of musicians, engineers, and conductors in a professional setting.

These reflections will be aligned with the **Massachusetts Curriculum Framework for the Arts** Standard 5: *Critical Response*, and will be assessed using a rubric focused on clarity, musical vocabulary, and personal insight.

- Students must stay in groups of three or more at all times.
- Attend all check-ins and meeting times promptly.
- Never leave assigned areas or enter restricted locations.

Personal Responsibility

- Students are responsible for their own belongings and materials.
- Follow the dress code and wear clothing suitable for walking and variable weather.
- Respect other people's space and property.

Health & Wellness

- Stay hydrated and eat regularly throughout the day.
- Follow medical procedures and communicate health needs to chaperones.
- Immediately report any illness or injury to a chaperone.

Hotel Room Expectations

- Stay in your assigned room. No switching rooms without permission.
- Room curfew is 9:30 PM; lights out at 10:30 PM.
- Do not enter other students' rooms unless authorized by a chaperone.
- Keep volume low and be respectful of hotel staff and guests.
- Students are financially responsible for any damage caused.

Chaperone Expectations

Supervision & Safety

- Maintain constant oversight of your assigned students.
- Conduct regular head counts.
- Be familiar with and ready to implement emergency procedures.

Professional Conduct

- Serve as a role model at all times.
- Refrain from using tobacco, alcohol, or other substances.
- Maintain confidentiality and student privacy.

Communication & Logistics

- Carry a charged phone and be reachable at all times.
- Work collaboratively with other chaperones and the trip leader.
- Attend all pre-trip meetings and complete all required forms.

Infractions and Discipline

- All infractions will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.
- Dr. Eddie Wilkin will serve as the lead administrator for all disciplinary matters.
- Chaperones will report concerns to Dr. Wilkin for review and action.
- Consequences may include warnings, loss of privileges, parent contact, or being sent home.
- Major infractions (e.g., substance use, theft, violence) may result in removal from the trip at family expense.
