COLLECTION OF MONEY FOR FOOD SERVICES

The Nantucket Public School's Food Service Program is intended to be user-funded, although it is supplemented by federal resources. Breakfast and hot lunch meals are available to students and staff who wish to purchase them. The charge to students and staff for breakfast and lunch shall be determined annually by the Nantucket School Committee. The charge for students meals shall be published annually in each school's student handbook.

The District may extend credit for student meals for elementary school children. A student's outstanding credit balance may not exceed \$50.00 (fifty dollars). When student or staff members reach the credit limit, credit purchases shall no longer be allowed.

The District may pursue legal means to recoup money owed, as well as the cost of collection.

The Superintendent shall publish rules and procedures related to this policy.
